

# SKINIAL – ANALYSIS – CHECKLIST

## 1. Preliminary considerations

### Where should the treatment be performed?

- Permanent make-up: eyebrows, lips, eyelids, face
- Body tattoo: from the neck down
- Treating multiple tattoos: possible, but planned and one after the other
- Note customer requests

### What should be treated?

#### Removal

- Treatment goal: quick removal or no time constraints?
- Sensitivity to side effects (e.g. scarring)?

→ Both factors influence the choice of method and the course of treatment.

#### Correction

- These are mostly minor treatments.

#### Treatment strategy

- For multiple areas: start with the easiest area.
- Only increase the difficulty from the second session onwards.
- For initial treatment, it is better to remove too little than too much.

## 2. Observations

### Pigment density

- High or low density?
  - influences technique and number of sessions
- It is better to schedule more treatments. If fewer are needed, the customer will be happy.

### Type of area

- Small areas: good for the FADING technique
- Dots/fine lines: better with the DOT technique

### Type of pigmentation

- **Microblading:** DOT technique (FADING is less suitable for fine lines)
- **Tattoos & PMU:**
  - Large areas → FADING
  - High pigment density → DOT more effective, but FADING is possible
  - Fine lines/dots → DOT more suitable
  - Quick removal / scars secondary → DOT
  - Gentle, safe removal / scar prevention → FADING

## Laser pre-treatment

- Always ask and document in the medical history form
- Indications of laser treatment: milky, irregular pigmentation, scarring
- With FADING → treat as normal
- With DOT → Patch-Test required
- IPL hair removal: Tattoos faded? Skin may be pre-damaged.

## Scars

- Ask customers specifically about scars and then document them:
  - **Keloids** – genetic in more than 50% of cases.
  - **Hypertrophic scars** – an overreaction of the skin to aggression, usually temporary.
  - **Sclerotic scars** – unsightly healing due to wound healing disorders
- Poor wound healing is often known to the customer – always make a note

## Sensitivity

- For pain-sensitive customers or sensitive skin:
  - Treat gently, schedule longer breaks and more treatments
  - The customer should obtain pain-relieving ointments and apply them beforehand

## Other

- Unclean/over-make-up customers → Risk of inflammation: recommend MEDICLEAN for home use to be on the safe side
- Dry skin → Treat with care, prone to bleeding
- Oily skin → More difficult to treat
- Nervous/complicated customers → Strictly adhere to the protocol for your safety

## ----- 3. Selection of technique and procedure -----

- Technique selection based on analysis:
  - **FADING** → 3-needle
  - **DOT** → 7-needle
  - Microneedling & derma roller: **not suitable**
- Determine treatment areas and number of passes/dots in advance
- Discuss rough estimate of number of sessions with customer
- Inform customers about additional sessions in case of changes (e.g. due to bleeding, pain)
